



Please read the following instructions carefully and include all items that are requested! Note qualifications, which determine eligibility.


- Applicants must be high school seniors attending PHS, PAAAS, or Pinnacle only.
- Complete the **2024 Clearinghouse Application**.
- Use the Scholarship checklist (Appendix A) as a reference to ensure you have uploaded the following required documents
- a. Student Activities Resume (this includes community service hours or letters signed) b. Personal Essay (Statement) Include a personal letter telling why you should be considered for a scholarship. Refer to special family circumstances (i.e. illness,unusual medical expenses, job loss, etc.) or other pertinent information that will support your application.
- c. Two letters of Recommendations (Uploaded in .pdf format with the signature of your recommender included) (a minimum of one from a teacher and/or second teacher, employer, clergyman, club advisor and or coach)
- d. SAT/ACT Score report
- e. School Transcript (Get official from School Counselor and upload)
- f. Any additional requirements from the sponsor (special essay community service letters or logs, etc.)
- All information requested on the scholarship application must be furnished. If all required sections are not completed, you will be disqualified. **Every** application must include an essay and activities resume.
- The application is available on the district and individual high school websites. Applicants are to follow the instructions of completion. Every senior will receive this information via email and/or Schoology.
- A student may apply to any of the scholarships in this bulletin for which he/she is eligible.
- Make sure you meet the **DEADLINE DATE OF Tuesday**, April 16, 2024.





Important Facts

- Each organization's scholarship chairperson will notify Mr. Tidwell of the applicants they wish to interview.
- Applicants will be notified of their status and given an appointment for interviewing.
- Interviews will be held on Wednesday, May 15, 2024 from 3:30-7:30pm for **ONLY in-person** interviews and Thursday, May 16, 2024 3:30pm-7:30pm for **ONLY virtual** interviews. It is important that you arrange with employers, coaches, etc as early as possible.
- Students being awarded a scholarship will be invited to the Thursday, June 6, 2024 Clearinghouse Scholarship & Senior Awards Program night at Charles & Anna Booker Elementary School. It is strongly encouraged for recipients to attend.
- Scholarship recipients will be announced at the Clearinghouse Scholarship & Senior Awards Program on Thursday, June 6, 2024.

Kayla was a member of the G.E.M.S. mentoring program and aspired to work in a health related profession. P.A.R.C. will award a scholarship to students with financial need who major in a health related profession, display academic achievement, a commitment to serving others (in school, in the community or at home), a strong work ethic, and leadership qualities.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- Male Student, member of the Plainfield, NJ community
- Have participated in high school sports for at least 2 years and shown leadership Have a grade point average of 2.3 or above
- Have post secondary education acceptance and plans
- Have completed the application that includes questions on your experiences with sports, community service, and mental health and how they have influenced your beliefs, relationships, and career aspirations.
- Submit 2 recommendation forms: one from a teacher or counselor and one from an athletic coach
- Participate in a brief interview

BRIEF RESPONSE QUESTIONS

- Describe your academic/career goals after high school and what has inspired these goals.
- Describe your participation within your community. What skills do you have and plan to develop to make an impact in your community?
- Describe your participation in athletics, including any leadership roles, and how this has impacted you.
- Describe your knowledge of and/or any experience(s) with mental health challenges. How might this awareness shape you and your future endeavors?

- > Any nationality, gender or religion
- ➤ Must have acceptance letter from an accredited 2 or 4 year college or university (no business or trade schools please)
